Our Focus

The TCWIB Green Sector Committee is one of five high growth sector collaboratives that addresses the employment and training needs of businesses and job seekers in Tulare County. The goal is to serve in an advisory capacity to provide input and feedback to the Tulare County Workforce Investment Board. This information is used to prioritize funding for workforce training, and to develop assessment strategies, learning opportunities, standards, curriculum, and partnerships for business and industry, workforce development professionals, job seekers, curriculum planners, educators, and labor.

Quick Facts

- “Green or clean” is a broad category that may include Wind, Solar, Water, Biofuels, Biomass, Hydrogen fuel cells, and Geothermal.
- Tulare County businesses identify an increasing need for mid-skilled level technicians with academic studies in biology, microbiology, chemistry, organic chemistry, algebra, statistics and physics.
- Discussions with regional educators indicate that students with these high levels of academic background are very likely to continue on an educational path to a four-year degree, and more likely an advanced degree in either physical science or life science.

Our Goals

- Develop a customized report for Tulare County that identifies green businesses.
- Define green businesses for Tulare County based on data and trends.
- Develop a Green Directory to market green businesses in Tulare County.
- Create career mapping for green jobs, including WorkKeys applications to existing jobs.
- Develop pre-apprentice/work-study programs for green jobs.
