

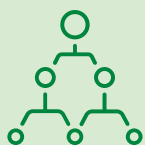

OVERVIEW

Careers in the Agriculture and Natural Resources sector fall into seven pathways: Agricultural Business; Agricultural Mechanics; Agriscience; Animal Science; Forestry & Natural Resources; Ornamental Horticulture; and Plant & Soil Science.

In 2023, there were a total of 96,274 jobs in the Fresno, Tulare, and Kings County region, and nearly half of those jobs were in support activities for crop production.
