OVERVIEW

Careers in the the Education, Child Development, and Family Services sector fall into four career pathways: Child Development; Consumer Services; Education; and Family & Human Services.

In 2023, there were a total of 109,927 jobs in the Fresno, Tulare, and Kings County region, and 37.9 percent of those jobs were in the Education and Hospitals industry.
