OVERVIEW

The Advanced Manufacturing industry cluster includes establishments that transform raw materials into new products.

Establishments in this sector are often described as plants, factories, or mills and characteristically use power-driven machines and material handling equipment. However, establishments that manufacture by hand or in the worker's home, and those engaged in selling products made on the same premises from which they are sold (bakeries, candy stores, custom tailors) may also be included in this sector.



The Advanced Manufacturing industry cluster is made up of 86 unique sub-sectors, 4 of which are shown in the following chart.

The largest sub-sector, *Animal Slaughtering and Processing*, only makes up 17% of all of the advanced manufacturing jobs in our region, revealing the diversity of work in this industry.
