a. Update: WIB Application for Out-of-School Youth Expenditures

The California Workforce Development Board has approved the WIB's application for a waiver of WIOA Section 129(a)(4)(A). The waiver decreases the out-of-school expenditure requirement from 75% to 50%, which provides additional flexibility to increase in-school youth enrollment of individuals who meet the WIOA-defined youth barriers related to foster care, justice-involved, and/or homelessness.
