b. Equity Target Population Fund (ETPF)

Gicel, a Workforce Analyst, presented a comprehensive ETPF program overview detailing its goals and objectives. In addition, she provided an update on the program's progress in the first quarter. Key highlights of this update included:

Desiree gave an overview of upcoming grants for which we have applied in collaboration with partner agencies to explore funding opportunities.

- i. Student Training and Employment Program (STEP)
 - Funding Request: \$750,000 Enrollments
 - Grant Period: January 1, 204-December 31, 2024
 - Enrollment Goal: 100
 - Expanded to all youth service areas

ii. Edison STEM Internship Project

Stipend Opportunities

Stipends range from \$250 - \$1,000.

- For students who reside within SCE Territory
- Internship or Project Based
- Tied to STEM related pathways or project

iii. Economic Development Pilot

Collaborative with Community Colleges and Adult Schools

Incentives

- Jump Start
- HSD/GED
- Testing Fees
